

Austria

- Official name: Republic of Austria
- Form of state: Federal republic of nine states
- Population of 9 million
- Vienna as federal capital and biggest city with 1.9 million (~2.6 million metro)
- Joined the EU in 1995, adopted the Euro in 2001
- One of three neutral countries in the EU
- Head of state: Alexander Van der Bellen (re-elected 2022)
- State legislatures: Nine state parliaments, with each appointing its own governor
- Federal chancellor: Karl Nehammer (ÖVP)

Trade

Well-developed domestic industry / a small population / can easily source goods and services from nearby countries

- ⇒ modest overall potential for direct export of Canadian products, with notable exceptions for highly specialized and niche products (e.g. in ICT, aerospace, advanced instruments).
- ⇒ Usually not an EU-entry market for Canadian exporters
- ⇒ Canadian merchandise exports to Austria = \$353.3 million in 2021 (+91.1% from 2020) / Imports from Austria = \$2.3 billion in 2021 up 20.1% from 2020.
- \Rightarrow Aircraft and aircraft parts + other transportation equipment and parts = 57.2% of exports.
- ⇒ Service exports to Austria were \$238.0 million in 2021 up 7.2% from 2020 while imports from Austria were \$272.0 million that same year, up 8.4% from 2020.
- ⇒ Germany is by far the top supplier to the Austrian market with 41% of imports in 2021, followed by Italy (6.4%), Switzerland (5.2%), Czech Republic and Netherlands. T
- ⇒ The share of imports into Austria is 0.16% for Canada and 1.8% for the U.S. The obvious language and geographical advantage retained by German companies make them extremely competitive on the Austrian market.



Canadian presence in Austria / Austrian presence in Canada

Canadian direct investment in Austria stands at \$8.1 billion in 2021, with about 20 Canadian companies present in the market













Over 133 Austrian companies have facilities or offices in Canada, of which 15 have production facilities, which amounted to an FDI stock of \$1.3 billion in 2020.
